

The Village of Grayslake is a municipality organized under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Illinois. The Village operations include police protection and public order, control over building and construction, vehicle regulation, public buildings, parking facilities, streets and public ways, garbage collection, operation of water and sewer systems, and various recreation facilities. The fiscal year 2020/2021 operating budget is \$19,098,489.

Village offices are located at: 10 South Seymour Avenue, 585 Berry Avenue, and 700 Center Street. The approximate number of full-time employees is 51.
