



The Village of Grayslake is a municipality organized under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Illinois. The Village operations include police protection and public order, control over building and construction, vehicle regulation, public buildings, parking facilities, streets and public ways, garbage collection, operation of water and sewer systems, and various recreation facilities. The fiscal year 2021/2022 operating budget is \$19,318,844

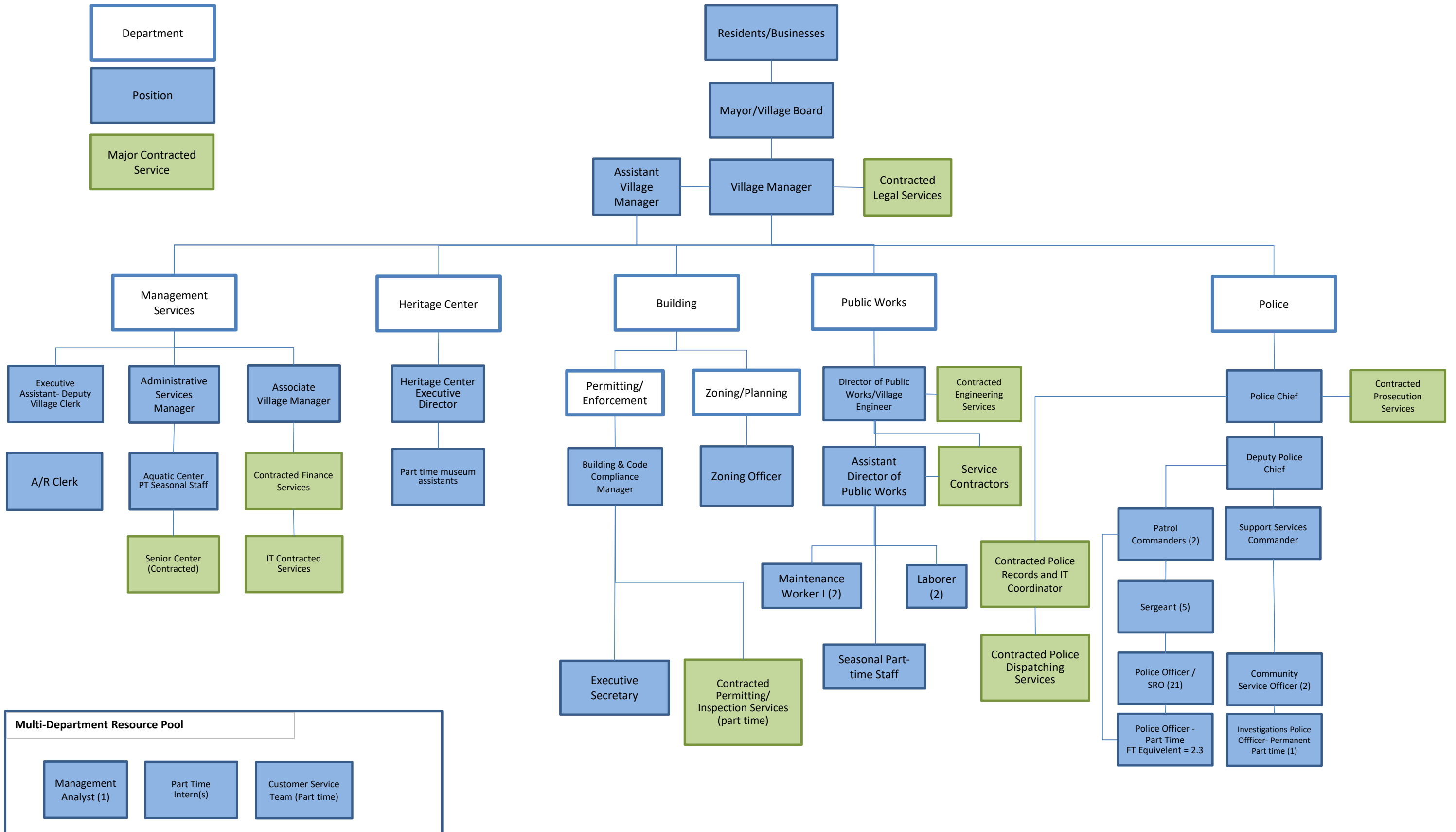
